Pittsburgh International Airport FAA Regional Fire Training Facility 1000 Harper Road, Imperial PA 15126

This class is designed for individuals who possess previous firefighting training and experience and are interested in participating in Airport Firefighting Operations. Goals of the class are to prepare students to work in the airport environment safely and competently.

This class will meet or exceed the required topics for airport firefighter training outlined in Federal Aviation Administration Part 139.319 (i)(2). This course is designed to provide the skills and knowledge required for certification to Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) as described in Chapter five of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1003, Standard for Airport Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications.

The class, for *experienced firefighters*, is a five-day interactive lecture with hands-on familiarization with aircraft, airport familiarization, communications, fire tactics and strategy, use of foam and application of chemical agents, safety and safety gear, specialized vehicles, jet engine fires, interior fire operations, cargo fire operations, rescue, use of structural apparatus for aircraft accidents, forcible entry to aircraft, and incident command. *Upon successful completion of the course, firefighters with IFSAC/Pro-Board Fire Fighter II are eligible to take the Certification Test.*
